Worship

Education

The Faith Formation Program instituted a Chidren's Liturgy of the Word at the 10 a.m. Mass. A Ministry Fair displayed information on parish organizations and groups in the autumn. Parishioners volunteered to participate in parish life. During November, a Circle of Life Seminar discussed aspects of end-of-life planning.

Service

The parish continued its community outreach. We shared proceeds from Our November Book of the Dead with The Chatham Children's Fund. The St. Vincent de Paul Society sponsored their Christmas Giving Tree. At Easter, proceeds from our Lenten Folders went to the Cape Cod Foster Closet. The parish renewed its support of pro-life causes with a Baby Bottle Boomerang for Your Options Medical and Walking with Moms In Need.
