Dear Friends,

First, I would like to thank you for the warm welcome you have shown to me and Fr. Thiago. We are both very happy and excited to be a part of this great community and to walk with each of you on the journey of faith.

I am also very grateful to Fr. Tom Washburn. He was given a unique assignment 5 years ago and soon after had to lead our three parishes through the turmoil and confusion of the Pandemic. COVID was a great challenge to all in parish ministry and involved a lot of trial and error. I feel very fortunate for the foundation he has built that will allow a great future to be built.

The report does show that we are facing quite a few challenges. However, these challenges are not insurmountable. Looking at parishes throughout the country we do know how to meet these challenges. There is no 'silver bullet', that is, no program or activity that will change things right away. Even though there are financial challenges, fundraising is not the solution. It is in changing the culture within our Catholic Community and each of us living out our identity as Christian disciples.

The first steps we have taken is to partner with Rebuilt Parish, a group out of Maryland that is one of the leaders in parish renewal. Utilizing the tools from Rebuilt, assessing where we are, the great work that Fr. Tom and the three parishes have accomplished these last few years, the Senior Leadership Team has put together a plan for FY24. Much of this plan will be establishing processes and structures to support and encourage the continued growth and vibrancy of our three parishes.

Ultimately our growth is not dependent on what I or the staff does. It is dependent on all of us trusting in the Lord and allowing the Lord to work through us to reach out to others. We are about forming Christian Disciples through Word, Sacrament and Service. We know when we are doing that when we will resemble the first parishes: They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers. (Acts 2:42)
