As we begin our fifth decade together as a community of faith, I am confident that with your faith, dedication, and your generosity; and that of our parish staff, assisting clergy, Iay ministers and many volunteers we will continue to meet our challenges and accomplish our goals as a parish and fulfill our mission to reveal the face of Christ in this portion of Cape Cod.

Parish Ministries and Serving Our Neighbors

We continued our compassionate support of neighbors in their time of need primarily through the works of the ministries noted herein and in the Parish website. Please note that these are simply highlights of some of

the many ways which members of the Christ the King Parish Family experienced the power of the sacraments and prayer during the past year.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of our ability to provide the many Parish service ministries; and, we desperately need more volunteers. If it so moves you to do so, please contact any of the parish volunteers to start the process.

CTK Food Pantry

CTK Food Pantry is open every Wednesday morning to provide food and other necessities to families in need. This operation is successful due to the support of the parish, parishioners and volunteers. 88 volunteers worked 15,444 hours during the last year. In addition, wonderful parishioners donated food, gift cards, money and other supplies to assist the food pantry. Monetary and food donations are also received from the Town of Mashpee, Mashpee Firefighters, Mashpee Commons and other local businesses.

During the last year 57,157 bags of food were distributed to 495 households that include 337 children, 232 seniors and 35 veterans. In addition, the following is also part of the pantry activities:

- Grocery Gift cards over 800 were distributed
- CTK Thrift Shop Clothing Vouchers 213 vouchers distributed

- St Joseph's House both food and prepared meals are provided to 1,920 clients
- Home bound households receive food in cooperation with the Cape Cod Cooperative Extension - 934 deliveries were made
- Improvements included the addition of an outdoor freezer and the Oasis platform to log pantry activities.
- Total expenses \$73,547

Faith Formation/Youth Ministry

The Faith Formation/Youth Ministry - Religious Education Program is a 9-year program working with children in grades 1-9+. Classes were held inperson, with some families opting to continue through Zoom or home-school options. Operating with four paid positions and 17 volunteer catechists with an overall enrollment of 130 students. 21 students received the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion; and 20 students received the Sacrament of Confirmation. The ministry works to expand parish and community involvement of students through the Youth Ministry program working with students in grades 8-12. Students engaged in several community service events, including supporting some parish ministries. The beloved annual student presentation of The Stations of the Cross was resumed this year with a unique Shadow Stations prayer journey. Our students supported our annual Family Thanksgiving Mass, and many of our high school aged students participated in the ECHO of Cape Cod retreat program. Our Confirmation students attended the nationally known Jason Everett guest speaker presentation. The ministry also handles all CORI checks for all parish staff and ministry volunteers.

Financial and Resource Assistance (FARA)

12 volunteer caseworkers provided approximately 4,500 hours of service. Their responsibilities include vetting qualified clients, client meetings, vendor contacts, financial assistance for vetted individuals and resource assistance for those both in and outside of our area of concern. During this fiscal year these volunteers provided emergency financial relief to 84 clients representing 169 family members, distributing \$96,151 in Matthew 25 (\$46,151) and CTK Golf Tournament donation funds (\$50,000). Caseworkers also distributed \$1,210 of Walmart and grocery gift cards to help clients with basic needs and special dietary issues. In addition,

2 Cape veterans (3 family members) received \$1,190 in emergency funds – using a grant provided by Heroes in Transition. These volunteer Caseworkers also managed the 2023 CTK Christmas Giving Tree program by vetting clients and then identifying qualified persons and distributing \$11,950 in Walmart gift cards to 70 clients (representing 159 children). The FARA volunteer Caseworkers manage these programs with minimal operating costs (primarily for database applications).

Knights of Columbus Council 13388

Our Council supports the Parish in its many ministries and donates their time, talent, and treasure to programs such as: Call-A-Knight program to assist elderly parishioners; support for 12 Cape Cod Healthcare Blood Drives; distributed 48 Coats for Kids for the Mashpee School District; and continues support for our senior altar servers. The Knights have developed a new High School Scholarship program at Saint John Paul II, and three students were awarded over \$5,000 in scholarships.

This year was another successful CTK Golf Classic Tournament with 120 golfers participating, and with over 70 Sponsors. This event garnered another donation of \$25,000 to the Financial and Resource Assistance Ministry, which over the last 3 years has donated \$100,000 to this CTK ministry.

This year the Council earned the 2023-2024 Star Council Award. It is considered the top award for local Councils. This award recognizes excellence in program activity, membership growth, insurance promotion, fraternal reporting and Safe Environmental Compliance.

Matthew 25 Account (M25)

This account collects all the donations given to the Parish for our charitable good works. Our Parish does not only preach the gospel but is also willing to apply it as we recognize Christ in those seeking our help with food and shelter, as well as warmth, light and transportation. This includes \$19,119 for the weekly Food Pantry managed by the CTK Conference of St. Vincent de Paul, and \$104,167 for the Financial and Resource Assistance Ministry. The FY2024 income was \$224,965 and expenses were \$132,641. This is sustained because of the generosity of the people of the Parish, and prior donations held in the M25 savings account; and in the CTK Depository Account held at the Diocese of Fall River.

Parish Thrift Shop

The 105 volunteers at the Thrift Shop provide approximately 350 - 400 hours/week. The Thrift Shop is open and accepts donations 3 days/week, primarily

through a new paved drive-thru process. Items are sorted and processed for sale to serve all customers, but primarily for those in need. Many items are donated to the needy and to St. Joseph House, or greatly reduced in price to help families. Food Pantry clients are given \$25.00 vouchers to use at the Thrift Shop to help with their clothing and household needs. This fiscal year the total vouchers given exceeded \$8,600.00. Baby clothing is given to A Baby Center in Hyannis to help parents with children in need. Revenues are used to pay expenses, and contributed \$301,023 to support the Parish.

Parish Website

Since the inauguration of the new Parish website in December 2022, the website has had over 330,005 "views" and has reached 95 countries. One very popular page is our "Live Streaming," which gets an average of 75,000 views per year, roughly 1,442 views per week. Feedback on the upgraded Live Stream has been very positive, with parishioners stating that "It feels like I'm right there." Our Live Stream brings into homes our weekend and daily Masses, Holy Days, as well as special Masses such as weddings and funerals. For the asking, we provide a "capture" for families who have lost a loved one and live too far away or cannot attend the funeral. With a video made of this special Mass, it helps the grieving process, and many watch the Mass when they are having a rough day or are missing their loved ones. The prayers and remembrances give them peace. It is due to the support of our parishioners that we can provide this service at a family's most vulnerable time.

<u>Pastoral Care to the Sick/Homebound, Seasons of</u> <u>Hope Bereavement and Mental Health Ministry</u>

There were 40 participants in the Seasons of Hope bereavement group, and the bereavement support ministry webpage had 457 views. The Mental Health Ministry launched its website page this year and had 502 views, including the care and prayer pages, and the support and education pages. 8 parishioners were trained in Mental Health First Aide and Spiritual Companion training. A Parish-wide information session was held in June in which NAMI provided education as to their program offerings. The next phase of the ministry will be to train group facilitators so that CTK may offer a Sharing and Reflection group to those struggling with their mental health and wellness. The ministry to the Sick and Homebound added 2 new ministers since our last report, and there are currently 14 volunteers trained for the ministry; with 15 sick and homebound individuals being visited. The webpage has also had 110 views.
