OCIA Discernment Questions

Approaching the end of the Catechumenate

Dear Catechumen/Candidate,

We are approaching the final phase of our OCIA journey. This is an appropriate time to pause and to reflect on where we have been and where we are going. The following questions are for you to reflect on your journey and to prepare for your discernment meeting. Please take some time over the next two weeks to set aside some time in prayer and reflection to discern and answer the following questions. This is not a test!

Remember, the discernment meetings are not an evaluation, but a time for you to pray and meet with one of the team members to discern where you have been and what lies ahead.

Before reflecting on the questions, please read and reflect on any one or all of the following Scriptures:

A. Blind Bartimaeus: Mk 10:46-52
B. The Prodigal Son: Lk 15: 11-32
C. The Woman at the Well: Jn 4:4-26
D. The Road to Emmaus: - Lk 24:13-35

PART 1. Reflect on the journey you have been on so far by thinking about and answering the following questions.

- a. How have you begun to experience a new identity, a new way of life, a new way of looking at the world, or a new way of experiencing the Lord?
- b. What has been the most influential or life-changing part of your journey so far during the OCIA process?
- c. How have you responded to the call to discipleship?



PART 2. Evaluate what ways you have seen change and growth during this journey.

- a. How do you feel you have grown in understanding the teachings and practices of the Catholic faith?
- b. What things might you still be struggling with or be confused about? Remember, this is normal ("faith seeking understanding").

PART 3. In each of the suggested Scripture readings at the beginning of these discernment questions there is a growing recognition and change of heart. Please describe how these may relate to the journey you have been on in the OCIA process.

- 1. How have you grown in your desire to pray and read Scripture?
- 2. How strong is your desire to live a truly Catholic life through participation in the sacraments and living according to the teachings of the Church?
- 3. How do you feel about spreading the good news of Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church to family, friends, co-workers, etc.?

PART 4. Do you feel you are ready to become one of the "elect" (Catechumens) or to be recognized by the Bishop (Candidates) at the Rite of Election, and to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist during the Easter Vigil?
