Bishop named diocesan chancellor

Bishop Sean O'Malley named Rev. Michael K. McManus Diocesan Chancellor, Wednesday, June 28. Fr. McManus will retain his diocesan Secretary for parishes.

A native of Immaculate Conception parish, Taunton, son of the late Joseph McManus and the late Helen (McManus) McManus. A graduate of Cassidy High School, Taunton, and Holy Cross College, Worcester, he taught at Holy Cross and was administrative assistant to the mayor of Taunton before entering St. John's Seminary, Brighton, to prepare for the priesthood.

After ordination on June 15, 1985, by Bishop Daniel A. Cahill, Father McManus was named vicar at St. Mary's Cathedral, Fall River, in June 1986, when he was appointed vice chancellor with residence at the cathedral. In December 1986 he was appointed Diocesan Finance Officer and was reappointed to that position in December 1987.

Since July 1987 he has resided on weekends at St. Mary's, Mansfield, and in October 1988 took up residence in the diocesan residence. He was appointed Secretary of Temporalities effective June 14, 1994.
